The Rabbi Emeritus of Woodside Synagogue is Rav Yitzchak Breitowitz. Rav Breitowitz was born in New York, and grew up in the Greater Hartford, Connecticut area. He received his Bachelor of Arts from Johns Hopkins University and obtained semicha from Ner Israel Rabbinical College, where his fellow students and teachers recognized in him unusual creativity and brilliance, as well as a unique ability to grasp complicated material and communicate it clearly to others. After graduating magna cum laude from Harvard Law School, he worked in private practice in Chicago, served as law clerk for the Honorable Susan Getzendanner of the U.S. District Court, and taught at the University of Illinois. He met and married Sally Naiman, and returned to Baltimore in 1983, to join the faculty of the University of Maryland School of Law, where he was a professor, specializing in bankruptcy and commercial law. Rav Breitowitz is the Rabbi Emeritus of Woodside Synagogue and currently lives in Israel and serves as a senior lecturer for Ohr Samayach.
